Activities and achievements

In the year,

- We had a very successful meetings programme with very good attendance throughout the season.
- We had another good Quiz night in December followed by the January member's experiences event.
- We had a very successful summer outing in June to Dalgarven Mill, which included a tour of the museum and the special exhibition, "the little black dress", by the curator.
- More new tyres for the buggies as well as new batteries for the Alloway buggy and
 expensive repairs to the Culzean petrol buggy. Fortunately, generous donation
 through the buggy collecting boxes has helped off-set the expenses (the service is
 free). We also have a number of new drivers who have joined the Culzean team, so
 most days should be covered in the new season. New all-weather covers will be
 purchased for the new season. The buggies continue to be much appreciated at both
 properties.
- We regained the gift aid tax from the donations for the new electric buggy at Culzean
 which enabled us to sponsor a new display case to hold the forensically reconstructed
 head of Robert Burns, which as a result, will eventually be on display at the Robert
 Burns Birthplace Museum.

Trustee remuneration and expenses

The trustees did not receive any remuneration or expenses during the year.

Reserves

Our policy is to build up reserves to a level to fund projects and make donations to the National Trust for Scotland as decided by the trustees. We ended this year with unrestricted reserves of £3,366.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30th April 2014 which are set out on pages 3 to 4.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
