Notes to accounts:

Note 1: Buggy donations

Note 2: Cost of functions and Governance costs

The National Trust for Scotland kindly arranged for the Ayrshire members' Centre to use the Education Pavilion at Burns Cottage without charge. I was given training in the necessary fire and security procedures, so am responsible for opening and closing the building for our meeting. We therefore have no expenses associated with our meetings, which includes the quiz night and holiday experiences meetings. Our quiz night does not raise funds.

Our outing this year was to Mount Stuart on Isle of Bute, via ferry and local bus. It required no prebooking so members paid for their tickets on the day.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30th April 2015 which are set out on pages 3 to 4.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

Basis of independent examiner's statement

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
